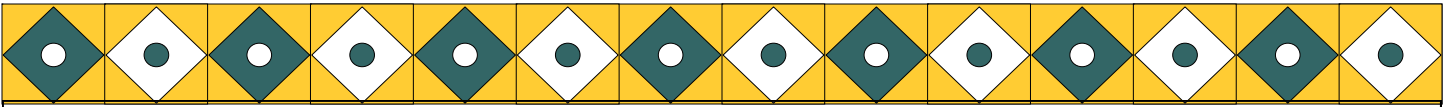

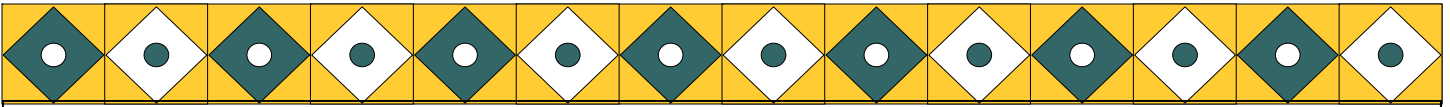

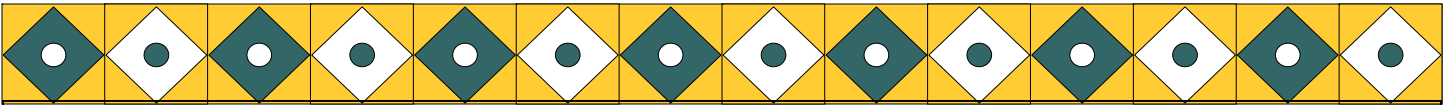

### **INTERMOUNTAIN VERSATILITY CIRCUIT RULES**

Competition in the Intermountain Versatility Circuit will be held under the following rules:

All competition will be in accordance with the MFTHBA Official Rules, Standards & Policies in effect at the time of the show.

Circuit participation and points awards and accumulation is in accordance with the rules for the 2008 MFTHBA Versatility Circuit Championship in effect at the time of the show. These, and all rules, can be found on the MFTHBA website – <http://www.MFTHBA.com>.

#### ***IMPORTANT POINTS:***

Competitors must be entered in the circuit before the start of the first class of circuit competition at the first circuit show they attend.

Competitors may compete in only one division.

Only horse and rider teams will accrue points, not individual horses or riders.

Competitors who must change horses may not transfer accrued points to the new horse. A new application must be made for the new horse/rider team.

We are the first leg of the Versatility Circuit which includes the Utah Great Western and the Powell show. There will be an open, amateur, and youth champion. This will be a combined point total from all three of these shows in the versatility classes including the cattle classes. There also will be an overall Ranch Horse champion crowned for the overall high point Ranch Horse from all three divisions.

#### ***POINTS EXPLANATION:***

Versatility Circuit points are awarded differently than normal versatility class competition. Remember that the circuit is competition within competition in the versatility class.

Points are awarded based on the number of horses entered in the class, with a maximum of 10 (ten) points to first place even if there are more than ten entries. i.e. If there are 10 or more entries first place receives 10 points and 10<sup>th</sup> place receives 1 point. If there are less than 10 entries, the points awarded will reflect that number. i.e. If there are 5 horses, first place will receive 5 points and 5<sup>th</sup> place will receive 1 point.

Points will be awarded to circuit participants based on the number of circuit participants in the particular class. i.e. If there are 20 total entrants in a class and there are only 6 circuit entrants, the highest placing circuit entrant will receive 6 points and the lowest placing circuit entrant will receive 1 point, regardless of where they place within the class.

### **VERSATILITY RULES**

All classes will be in accordance with the MFTHBA Official Rules, Standards & Policies in effect at the time of the show.

### **15th Annual Points Show Registration Information**

#### **Entry Forms:**

An entry form must be submitted for each competing horse/exhibitor team.

All classes being entered should be clearly marked on the entry form. A copy of the horse (s) MFTHBA registration papers must accompany each entry form.

All exhibitors are required to check-in with the Show Secretary upon arrival.

#### **Entry Fees:**

Class registration fees are \$10.00 per class entered if postmarked by June 27, 2009. Class fees for registrations postmarked after June 21 are \$12.00 per class.

A \$5.00 office fee applies to all entries.

On Wednesday, July 8th the Show Secretary office will open at 4 p.m. to accept new applications or corrections to previously submitted registrations. The secretary office will close at 7 pm. The office will open at 7:30 a.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday to accommodate new class entries and changes for that day (s) classes only. Secretary office will close 8:30 a.m. .

Class fees are non-refundable.

#### **General Rules:**

All competition will be conducted in accordance with the Missouri Fox Trotting Horse Breed Association Official Rules, Standards & Policies, in effect at the time of the show.

All exhibitors are required to advance to the gate area when their class is called. Gate holds may be requested of the Gate person, but must be approved by the show manager.

For individual horse classes, exhibitors will be assigned an order of entry into the arena based on a random drawing, and will be called to the show ring in that order by the announcer.

Any person not having his/her horse under sufficient control shall be dismissed from the show ring and disqualified from that class. This rule will be strictly enforced by the presiding Judge.

Show Management has the right to dismiss any exhibitor from the show grounds or any class for non-compliance or violations of rules

Protests will be administered in accordance with Article XI – Show Protests on page 83 of the rulebook. The required documentation and \$300 deposit is to be submitted to the BSFTA Show Chairman.

Show Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any classes due to lack of entries.

#### **Rider Status:**

**Youth Exhibitor** - A youth is defined as anyone 17 years or younger as of January 1st of the current calendar year.

**Amateur Exhibitor** - An Amateur Exhibitor must apply to the MFTHBA for an Amateur Status Card. A copy of this card must be submitted at or before the time of registration.

**Novice Exhibitor** - Any competitor who has not won a blue ribbon in the particular class in which they register or championship in any division is considered a novice of this show.

**Open Exhibitor** - Professional Status cards are not required for participation in the BSFTA show.

#### **Horse Status:**

**Regional Horse Definition** - Regional Horse designated classes are open to only those horses foaled, raised, trained, and owned by a full time resident of the states of Alaska, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.

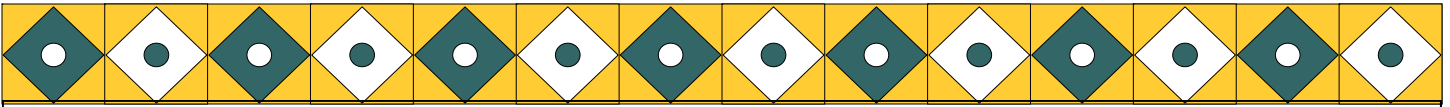
#### **Special Entry Form Information:**

Exhibitors must declare on the entry form the division they elect to compete in for consideration of the All-Around Champion award, Laurie DeMarois Memorial Versatility Award .

Exhibitors will accrue points for the National High Point championship in the classes indicated in BOLD lettering on the included class schedule.

**VERSATILITY RULES:**All classes with the exception of NOVICE classes will be in accordance with the MFTHBA Official Rules, Standards & Policies in effect at the time of the show. **A horse can be shown in only one trail class.**

Two different riders can ride the same horse in the Youth trail class and the Novice trail class.

**Trail Class:** After the trail class is set up that NO Competitors can walk through the course without the Judge present. To do so would result in disqualification and a non refunded entry fee for that class.  
Two different riders can ride the same horse in the Youth trail class and the Novice trail class.

### **All-Around Horse and Rider Champion**

The All-Around Championship Award is open to all 3 years and older horses.  
Exhibitors must indicate on the Entry Form whether they will be competing for this award in the Open or Amateur division.  
The same exhibitor must ride or show the horse in the required classes below for consideration to become the All-Around Champion.  
To be eligible for consideration, the horse/exhibitor team must compete in the following classes:

#### **Open All-Around**

Model: Class 4 or 5  
Performance : Class 23  
Versatility: Class 20 or 63, 49, 70, 74

#### **Amateur All-Around**

Model: Classes 4 or 5  
Performance: Classes 24  
Versatility: Classes 21 or 64, 50, 71, 75

#### **Hi - Point Youth**

Model: Classes 3A or 3B  
Performance: Classes 26 or 33  
Versatility: Classes 22 or 66, 52, 73, 77

Points will be awarded to each horse/exhibitor team in the order of their placement in each class as follows:

- 1st Place: 5 points
- 2nd Place: 4 points
- 3rd Place: 3 points
- 4th Place: 2 points
- 5th Place: 1 point

The exhibitor with the highest accumulated point total will be designated as All-Around Champion.  
In the event of a tie, winners will be determined using the following criteria in the order listed until the tie is resolved:  
Total number of highest placement points earned in Performance 2-Gait, Performance 3-Gait, Versatility  
Most number of first place finishes in the classes where highest placement points were earned  
Ride-off to be determined by the Show Committee

The Laurie DeMarois Memorial Versatility Award will be awarded to the Open, Amateur, and Youth horse and rider team who accumulates the most points in the following classes:
